### **Anti-Social Behaviour**

The Sevenoaks District Community Safety Unit take all reports of anti-social behaviour very seriously. A briefing is held daily (mon-fri) to discuss the reports received by Kent Police, the District Council, Housing Associations and KCC Community Wardens. Actions are reviewed and recorded, ensuring that residents receive feedback about their concerns.

Residents play an important role in helping us address anti-social behaviour in the community by reporting any problems they are experiencing to the appropriate agencies. This will enable agencies to understand the problems affecting the communities and ensure resources are put in place to tackle the behaviour. Agencies can only be aware of anti-social behaviour if residents report it as and when it is happening.

If individuals are identified as causing consistent anti-social behaviour they are referred to the ASB Task Group. This is a multi-agency meeting held monthly to discuss and work with named individuals to address their behaviour. Actions include issuing warning letters and Acceptable Behaviour Agreements as well as putting supportive interventions in place.
