	5.1 Parking in Westerham, Parking Working Group	
	Assistant Clerk had discussed with Richard Parry at the Annual Town Meeting.	
	Richard Parry agreed to look into and discuss with SDC and KCC.

	The knocked/blown down signs had been re-installed and blown down again.	
	The issue of the posts being fit for purpose had been raised by the Assistant

	KCC advised that the worded "Caution, Concealed Roads" sign suggested by	
	WTC would not be official. However, Alan Gibbons, KCC Highways Steward	
	had agreed to install a red triangle staggered junction sign on the A25 to	
	advise drivers of Farley Lane and Goodley Stock Road.	
	5.4 Speed Watch Campaign

	Goodley Stock Road residents present at the meeting said that they would be	
	interested in attending training to become speed watch volunteers for Goodley	DR
	Stock Road. Agreed that Assistant Clerk would contact Kent Police to enquire if	UK
	Goodley Stock Road would be a suitable speed watch site	
	5.5 Brasted Temporary 30mph signs	

Temporary 30mph signs had been put up along the A25 at as part of Brasted's speed watch campaign. The parish council had purchased them at a cost of approx. £600.

## 5.6 Hosey Hill traffic calming petition

Fifteen residents of Hosey Hill were present at the meeting to the discuss traffic calming petition raised by Mr Coates following the tragic accident on 25 March on Hosey Hill when a cyclist was killed.

Proposed traffic calming measures;

- Lengthen double yellow lines on Hosey Hill. Yellow lines to be extended/joined between Hosey Ridge and Wayside. The point where the fatality on 25 March took place. Reason - Line of sight is impaired by parked vehicles.
- 2) Move 30mph speed limit back to the top Hosey Hill Car Park. Reason -To reduce speed of vehicles coming down Hosey Hill.
- 3) Install 30mph signage at the bottom of Hosey Hill with the junction of High Street, Westerham (A25) currently no speed signage in place.
- 4) Install Flashing speed sign on Hosey Hill, showing vehicle speed. Reason to advise drivers of their speed coming down Hosey Hill.

H&L supports the traffic calming petition and has written to SDC, KCC and MP Michael Fallon requesting traffic calming measures. Assistant Clerk to forward WTC's correspondence to Mr Coates who has been given permission to speak on the issue at the next joint transportation board meeting to be held on 26 May.

The Assistant Clerk reported that a Hosey Hill resident is regularly reporting HGV's using Hosey Hill despite the advisory signage. Assistant Clerk had contacted KCC to ask for their support in contacting the companies to advise that whilst there is no limit or restriction the road is unsuitable for HGV's. The KCC lorry watch/freight team had agreed to do this.

### 5.7 Speed Limit Goodley Stock Road

Three residents were present at the meeting to discuss their request for the National Speed limit to be lowered along Goodley Stock Road. Emails had also been received from most of the Goodley Stock Road residents in support of the request.

Cllr Rodgers clarified that the issue must be dealt with separately to Hosey Hill. The Town Council had made a request to KCC to lower the speed limit. Reference KCC 210413 and had been advised by KCC that the first stage would be a speed survey costing approximately £500-700. This could be paid for by Richard Parry under his KCC members Fund and carried out by either KCC or an approved private company. Approved signage would also need to be paid for. Cllr Richard Parry has asked his Highways Engineer to advise on how best to proceed.

### 5.8 Bollards in Westerham

Julian Cook, KCC had advised where possible they will look to replace like for like. Julian suggested contacting Richard Parry to see if he would partially fund the replacement of bollards via the Community Grant Fund. The Clerk is obtaining quotes for the work. It will need to be discussed further by Council which budget (APOS or H&L) the remaining cost for the work will be paid from if not totally paid for by KCC.
