**Westerham Memory Walk**  
**Fighting Dementia Together**



Westerham Town Council is organizing a Memory Walk on Westerham Green Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> May at 11am.

The Walk will not only be in memory of Margaret Payne but also in memory of the regular attendees of the Forget-me-not Café who passed away in 2017, Wendy Willson, George Wells, June Webb and Marie Freeman, together with loved ones of those taking part. Dementia is a growing problem in society and it is important to raise awareness of this condition within our community.

We will be giving the option of either a short walk around the Green for our less able residents or a walk of approximately 1k walk around King Georges Playing Field. In addition, we plan to have a tree or similar on The Green where participants can hang personal messages.

This will not be a sponsored event but we will have collection buckets available. The proceeds will be split between for the Forget-me-not Café in Westerham and Sevenoaks Area Dementia Friendly Community Forum.

Kent Fire and Rescue Service (KFRS) has teamed up with singer and Kent resident Cheryl Baker to encourage people across Kent and Medway to think about people we know who may live alone or in isolation, or just someone who might need a bit of extra support, so together we can keep them safe and well, and reduce their risk from fire.

### **What is Show You Care?**

Show You Care is a new initiative by Kent Fire and Rescue Service (KFRS) which aims to help make the lives of people in our community who may live in isolation or feeling the pressure of life to feel valued, safer and less isolated. Not having someone to talk to regularly can be lonely and isolating, particularly if you're used to sharing your home and time with others. It's estimated that in Kent and Medway there are more than 40 thousand over 65s living socially isolated lives. KFRS is calling on people like you to think about how you can help someone you know by calling in for a chat and even think about helping with our 'Simple STEPS to staying safe and well' which will help reduce the fire risk in their home.

### **How can I help people live a safer life?**

The KFRS 'Simple **STEPS** to staying safe and well' are:



**S** is for **SLIPS**  
Are there potential tripping hazards?

**T** is for **TEST**  
Is the Smoke alarm working?  
Do the batteries need replacing?

**E** is for **ELECTRICS**  
Can you spot any hazards like overloaded sockets?

**P** is for **POTS & PANS**  
Does the oven or hob need a clean  
to reduce the risk of fires?

**S** is for **STAY**  
Make time for a tea and a chat

The Community Safety Unit (CSU) consists of Council Staff, Police, Community Wardens, Housing Associations and other partner agencies.

Partners meet on a daily basis to discuss Community Safety Concerns and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) calls that have come in from residents and partner agencies including the Police.

The CSU is a great way for partners to address current concerns and have a speedy and effective response to residents of which all are updated.

The CSU also focuses on safety campaigns and we have great initiatives for residents in rural and urban areas to keep them safe and their belongings safe. The CSU has timer switches, shed alarms, personal alarms and card protectors to name but a few which are free to residents.
