Westerham's Annual Town Meeting

18th April saw some 150 Westerham residents gathered in Westerham Hall to hear what their elected representatives had done during the year. And there was good news. Chairman Cllr Alan Wesley was able to report that in addition to providing day to day services to the town: street lighting, allotments, work with the young and the more mature of the town, the care of King George's Field and Crockham Hill's playing field, it had received a substantial CIL payment (Community Infrastructure Levy – the charge levied on developers to fund improvements in the community). This would help to pay for much needed facilities in the town: the replacement of the Fullers Hill toilets, a new bridge from the Darent car park to King George's Field, and the purchase of mobile CCTV equipment, sadly needed to combat vandalism in the town.

But the main focus of the meeting, and the one on which those attending wanted more information, was the Which Way Westerham proposal for the development of the town. When asked for their views on the emerging plans last autumn, 86% of those who responded to the Town Council's poll voted against it, and a similar proportion responded in the same way to Sevenoaks District Council's survey at the same time.

Residents asked speakers County Cllr Nick Chard, District Councillors Kevin Maskell and Diana Esler and Town Council Chairman Alan Wesley about the detailed information they felt was missing from the WWW plans revealed thus far. Anxiety was expressed about the reliability of the data provided – which Councillors agreed needed to be independently validated. Questions were asked on how proposals which were not yet complete could be adequately assessed by Sevenoaks District Council planners in time to meet their planned release date of June for the draft Local Plan which will determine where development will take place over the next 15-20 years. Opposition to the size of the development within the Green Belt and especially in the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty which enfolds Westerham was clear as was the concern that a relief road and 600 houses could only increase air pollution in the north of the town and on the boundaries of Churchill Primary School. Councillors admitted to frustration at the lack of detail currently available and confirmed that they had raised their concerns formally with SDC planners.

Westerham would soon be asked for its views on 'Westerham Design Statement'. Created by the people who live and work in the Parish, it sets out guidelines for future development. Now approved by Sevenoaks District Council it will form part of the statutory planning

system once the community has expressed its views on the final version. Cllr Wesley urged all residents to take advantage of this opportunity to say how they would like to see the future of their town. The Town Council would be holding further public meetings and discussions as the process continues.
