### **Sevenoaks District Council Draft Local Plan**

Westerham Town Council was pleased to hear that the Which Way Westerham proposals had not been included in the draft Local Plan published last week. Sevenoaks District Council planners have concluded that, 'the infrastructure proposals are not supported by the relevant providers and it has not been demonstrated that the benefits of the development outweigh the harm to the Green Belt and the AONB'.

This is not the end of the story. This draft Local Plan still has to be discussed and approved by SDC's Planning Advisory Committee, its Cabinet and the full Council before being submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for final agreement, probably early next year. Which Way Westerham will have the right to appeal.

Westerham Town Council will continue to stay abreast of developments, to represent its residents' views and will as ever Keep You Informed.

### **Covers Farm Planning application**

The application to restore Squerryes Sandpit has been released for consultation. This is a very weighty document in which the major argument is that the pit (now a deep lake) must be filled in by importing by road via Biggin Hill or via Brasted and Sundridge to Beggars Lane 800,000 cubic meters of infill. From the Beggars Lane

roundabout some 200 lorries a day would travel along a haul road, to be constructed between London and Croydon Road. The project is expected to take some 6 years.

Your Council is examining the detail, will be taking professional advice and will be seeking to establish that any work needed is the minimum necessary and is carried out with the minimum disruption to Westerham and its neighbours. We will keep you informed.

We are currently undertaking some of the finishing touches, such as extending the post and rail fencing in the Darent car park to meet the handrail of the bridge on either side. We are monitoring the surface of the access path as it may need additional work to ensure that the whole surface solidifies.

## Free Christmas tree collections

After this year's festivities have ended, Sevenoaks District Council will collect and recycle your real Christmas tree for free.

From Wednesday 2 January until Friday 1 February, the Council will collect any tree with a trunk of up to 90mm (3.5 inches) in diameter.

Simply leave your tree at the boundary of your property, and visible from the road, by 7am on the day the Garden Waste Collection Service visits your road.

If you're not sure when the service is scheduled for your area, visit [www.sevenoaks.gov.uk/collectiondays](http://www.sevenoaks.gov.uk/collectiondays) and search for your road.

All the trees collected are turned into environmentally friendly compost and for this reason, the Council cannot take trees which are decorated or in pots or stands.
